Before a four-lane highway bridge on Highway 73 (now known as Interstate 10) existed, people traveled to and from the Baytown area to Houston on a 2,800-foot trestle bridge that crossed the San Jacinto River.

This year's ornament will depict the old Market Street Road Bridge that was near Four Corners in shades of gray, black, and white on a 3-¼ inch round satin light blue glass ball. A brief history of the bridge is printed on the backside of the ornament.
